THE couple face down the hall, the gentleman with right arm round lady's waist, the lady's left hand resting on gentleman's right shoulder. Advance with polka step to four first bars of music, lady beginning with right foot and gentleman with left. The gentleman then takes lady's right hand with his left, and they do four *circular* steps of polka, then repeat from first *ad lib.*, similar to Barn Dance.
